Public Health Occupation	Median Pay	Job Outlook
Environmental and Occupational Health Sciences		
Environmental Scientists and Specialists	\$69,400 per year in May 2017.	Employment of environmental scientists and specialists is projected to grow 11 percent from 2016 to 2026, faster than the average for all occupations.
Occupational Health and Safety Specialists	\$73,600 per year in May 2017.	Projected to grow 4 percent from 2014 to 2024, slower than the average for all occupations

Community Health Sciences

Health Educator	\$45,360 per year in May 2017.	Overall employment of health educators and community health workers is projected to grow 16 percent from 2016 to 2026, much faster than the average for all
Medical and Health Services Managers	\$98,350 per year in May 2017.	occupations. Employment of medical and health services managers is projected to grow 20 percent from 2016 to 2026, much faster than the average for all occupations.
Healthcare Social Workers	\$56,810 per year in May 2017.	Growth by 2020, 26.8%
Mental Health and Substance Abuse Social Workers	47,830 per year in May 2017.	Growth by 2020, 22.8%
Substance abuse, behavioral disorder, and mental health counselors	\$43,300 per year in May 2017.	Employment of substance abuse, behavioral disorder, and mental health counselors is projected to grow 23 percent from 2016 to 2026, much faster than the average for all occupations.



Epidemiology /Biostatistics

Epidemiologists	\$69,660 per year in May 2017.	Employment of epidemiologists is projected to grow 9 percent from 2016 to 2026, about as fast as the average for all occupations.
Statisticians	\$85,160 in May 2017.	Projected to grow 34 percent from 2014 to 2024, much faster than the average for all occupations. Growth is expected to result from more widespread use of statistical analysis to make informed business and healthcare decisions.

Health Policy and Administration / MHA

Social and Community Service Managers	\$64,100 per year in May 2017.	Employment of social and community service managers is projected to grow 18 percent from 2016 to 2026, much faster than the average for all occupations.
Medical and Health Services Managers	\$98,350 per year in May 2017.	Employment of medical and health services managers is projected to grow 20 percent from 2016 to 2026, much faster than the average for all occupations.

TRANSFERABLE SKILLS



An essential component of the job search is understanding *your transferable skills*. A transferable skill is an ability/skill developed in one setting that can be used in multiple and wide ranging roles. Transferable skills can be categorized in areas such as: Communication, Interpersonal, Data Collection, Public Speaking, Listening, Technology, etc. Public health skills are versatile and it is important to identify and effectively market your transferable skills.

Health educators typically do the following:

- Assess the health needs of the people and communities they serve
- Develop programs and events to teach people about health topics
- Teach people how to manage existing health conditions
- Evaluate the effectiveness of programs and educational materials
- Help people find health services or information
- Provide training programs for community health workers or other health professionals
- Supervise staff who implement health education programs
- Collect and analyze data to learn about a particular community and improve programs and services
- Advocate for improved health resources and policies that promote health

Community health workers typically do the following:

- Discuss health concerns with community members
- Educate people about the importance and availability of healthcare services, such as cancer screenings
 - Collect data
- Report findings to health educators and other healthcare providers
- Provide informal counseling and social support
- Conduct outreach programs
- Facilitate access to the healthcare services
- Advocate for individual and community needs
